BARRIERS IDENTIFIED

- Language barriers
- Fear and lack of trust
 - Lack of awareness to resources
- Technology

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Train the trainer programs for community leaders
- Participate in events and partner with leaders in the community
- Educate the community including information on ADA
- Adding other forms of communication

"Here it feels that they do not have the capacity of support the Hispanics."

"One of the biggest issues is access to public services, in California you can get some services even if you are undocumented, but people are scared so they do not come for those services."

"After covid, a lot of parents had many barriers accessing trainings and information."

"If you can get a group and come down to our county and speak at schools and churches, that would be great, or just for the community itself."

CONSIDER THESE SPECIFIC STRATEGIES

- Continue outreach efforts across the region especially considering the Latino/Hispanic population in California (as one of the states with most Latinos), and in other states in the region as this community continues to grow.
- Connect with local community partners, organizations, and radio stations to build connections and spread information about the ADA
